
EASTER CRAFTS: HATCHING CLOTHESPIN EGGS



With this fun and creative craft, not only does it make a cute Easter craft, it can easily be interchangable with any holiday or occasion! As Easter is coming up, we've used the opportunity to create this hatching egg. You can easily change it up to a present box, letter, anything really! What makes it unique is that what's inside the egg/box can be whatever you want, as long as it fits!

You will need:

NATURAL CLOTHESPINS – 506-750
FOAM SHEETS – ASSORTED COLOURS – 506-430AST
DOUBLE SIDED STAMP TAPE – 706-317
CONSTRUCTION PAPER ASSORTED COLOURS – 500-300AST
BLACK AND ORANGE MARKER
SCISSORS – 502-130
GLITTER GLUE - 706-202



- 1. The first step is to cut an egg shape out of any foam sheet colour of your choice.
- 2. About a little more than half ways up, cut a zig zag line through your egg shape.
- 3. For my egg, I will be making a chick on the other side when you open the egg. I've also cut a little foam rectangle to attach to the bottom of the chick, so the paper isn't so flush with the clothes pin. This will decrease the chance of the chick getting squished when you open or close it.
- 4. Using your stamp tape, open your clothespin (to prevent the two ends from sticking) and press it along the side of the clothes pin. stick on your foam egg on the front, and your chick on the other side.



- 5. When you open your clothespin, it should look like this now!
- 6. Using your glitter glue, decorate your egg however you'd like!
- 7. Let your design dry, and now you're done!

Here is another example of an egg you can do as well.



Instead of a chick "inside" the egg, I've input a cute little Easter message!
