EASTER CRAFTS: PAPER PLATE HATCHING CHICK



With Easter around the corner, we've got an adorable little chick we'll be making today! Kids will love the movable hinged top portion of the egg, allowing the chick to pop it's head out! As always, all products will be listed below and are available for purchase on our website!

You will need:

UNCOATED PAPER PLATES – 115-520 WIGGLE EYES – 506-520 BRASS FASTENERS – 703-929 YELLOW FEATHERS – 506-660YLW FELT SQUARE SHEETS YELLOW 25PK – 510-470-25YLW FELT SQUARE SHEETS ORANGE 25PK – 510-470-25ORG ELMER'S SCHOOL GLUE – 640-150 SCISSORS – 640-155

Instructions:

- 1. Take 1 yellow felt sheet and cut out a long semi circle shape. This will be the body of your chick.
- 2. Using your orange felt sheet, cut out a small triangle to use as the beak.
- 3. Glue the chick's body, beak, eyes and feathers all on one plate.



4. Taking a second plate, cut a zig zag design across the middle of the plate, creating a "hatched" egg look.

5. Taking the bottom portion of the egg, line the edge with elmer's glue and glue it along the bottom edge of your plate with your chick on it. This will make the bottom half of your egg.

6. Taking your top half of your cracked egg, stick a fastener through the left edge. Stick the fastener through to the plate with the chick on it. This will act as a hinge for your egg!



This is what your egg should look like closed.



Surprise! Now you have the most adorable little chick hatching out of its egg.
